OLD BUSINESS

a. Consider Revised Proposed Tattoo and Body Piercing Ordinance

Mr. Arnold reported that the Borough Solicitor reviewed the revised draft of the proposed tattoo and body piercing ordinance distributed by the Lancaster County Inter-Municipal Committee

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(LIMC). As indicated by the Borough Solicitor, it is a policy decision for Borough Council whether to regulate tattoo and body piercing establishments. There is no knowledge of any such establishments within the Borough and the one such establishment which was the subject of a Zoning Ordinance enforcement action has since located outside of the Borough. Such establishments are permitted only within the General Commercial District and if there are no such establishments presently within the Borough, Council may wish to consider whether such regulations are necessary from a cost perspective, i.e. advertising, enactment, etc.

There was consensus by the Planning Commission that they had no comment on the subject and that approval of the ordinance would be for Borough Council to decide.

BOROUGH MANAGER

a. Congestion at West Frederick Street and Shenks Lane Intersection

Mr. Arnold and Mr. Visniski met with PennDOT and they suggested a way to alleviate congestion is that the current entrance and the exit to the "Library" Parking Lot be made into an entrance only and the exit would be placed further west at the "Computer Building" Parking Lot. PennDOT's opinion was that this scenario would reduce some of the congestion.
