Millersville Seeks Public Input on Future Development

Where should new businesses be encouraged? What types of housing should be allowed in various areas, particularly on lands near Routes 999 and 743? What should be done to protect existing neighborhoods? What street improvements are needed? What parks and trails improvements are needed? How can we make Millersville safer and more convenient for pedestrians and bicyclists? How can we improve environmental sustainability? How can there be greater cooperation between the University and the Borough?

Those are some of the questions that will be asked at a meeting on the Millersville Comprehensive Plan. A meeting will be held on Thursday May 5, 2022 at the Eshleman Elementary School at 545 Leaman Avenue, which is north of Manor Avenue. The meeting will begin at 7 pm, with a 6:30 pm open house to allow persons to informally review maps.

There will also be two additional public meetings in the future.

The Comprehensive Plan is an overall set of policies for the development and conservation of various areas of Millersville over the next 10 years. The plan addresses land uses, housing, transportation, community facilities, natural features, sustainability, and ways to carry out the plan. The Comprehensive Plan will include recommendations for updates to certain zoning regulations, in addition to other policies.
