As we wrap up another beautiful summer and prepare for the changing seasons ahead, I'm pleased to share updates on the important work happening throughout our community. This season has been one of progress and community engagement, and I'm excited to highlight the initiatives that continue to make Millersville Borough a wonderful place to call home.

This summer has been marked by significant community achievements and successful programs. Our inaugural Hometown Heroes Banner Program exceeded expectations, with twenty-three banners honoring past and present members of the Armed Forces now proudly displayed throughout the Borough. These banners, which went up just in time for Memorial Day, serve as a visible reminder of our community's respect and gratitude for those who have served our nation.

Our infrastructure improvements continue to move forward as well. The 2025 paving project with New Enterprise Stone & Lime Co. has been progressing, improving road conditions and enhancing safety for our residents. Changes to Online Utility Payments



The Borough recently upgraded our utility billing software used to service sewer/trash customers and you should have received your first bill from MuniBilling. On your bill, you received information on how to connect to the new customer portal, including the portal URL and a unique access code to set up your account.

Through the new customer portal, you may:

- Make a one-time payment
- Set up autopay
- Review your bill and payment history
- Make payments by credit/debit card or e-check

Instructions to Set Up Customer Account:

- Customer Portal: to create an account, go to the URL on your utility bill and click Create New Account.
- Fill in New Customer Account: enter your Account #, unique access Code and Email address, then click "Create Account".
- Confirm My Account: An email will be sent with a link – click the link to confirm your account. From this link, you will be prompted to "Confirm My Account" by entering your username and password.

2025 Special Trash Collections

WOODY/YARD WASTE (WYW) COLLECTION

Woody/Yard Waste (WYW) Collection will continue **through MONDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2025**. WYW includes branches and prunings from trees and shrubbery, acorns, pinecones and nut burrs. During the collection period, WYW is prohibited from being treated as a trash item. If found untagged, it will not be collected by the hauler.

LEAF COLLECTION

Monday, November 3, 2025 **Monday, November 17, 2025**

All scheduled curbside leaf pickups listed above are FREE of charge for residential customers only and will not require extra service tags during the leaf collection period. **The leaf collection is for LEAVES ONLY** in the biodegradable bags. **DO NOT PUT YARD WASTE IN WITH YOUR LEAVES.** Pine needles are accepted with leaf collection. Please do not put trash, sticks or yard waste in with your leaves. The hauler will not take the brown bags that have yard waste or trash mixed in during the leaf collection period.

For both WYW and Leaf collections, residents must place WYW or leaves into biodegradable brown bags which are available to Borough trash & recycling residents and are located in the Police Carport at the rear of the Borough Office. Please limit the number of bags you pick up, at the carport, to 20 bags per visit. Please **DO NOT** tape or staple bags. If you have a bag of WYW or leaves to dispose of after the WYW or leaf collection period

has ended, treat it as a trash item and put it in a trash bag and put it in your toter. The biodegradable bags should not be used after the WYW and leaf collections have ended. If you already have your toter limit, you must tag the trash bag with a **YELLOW SERVICE TAG**. Please see your Trash and Recycling Newsletter for more information on WYW and leaf collections.

LARGE APPLIANCE AND TIRE COLLECTION

Monday, October 20, 2025

When large appliances (white goods) are thrown out, many of them require special disposal because some items contain a large amount of metal and may also contain refrigerant. Appliances that contain refrigerants include refrigerators & freezers (with doors removed), air conditioners, water coolers, dehumidifiers, and water heaters. Tires also require special disposal.

- Each appliance must be scheduled for pickup and tagged with a **\$12.00 BLUE APPLIANCE TAG**.
- Each tire must be scheduled for pickup and tagged with a **\$4.00 RED TAG**. A tire on a rim requires two red tags.

Blue Appliance Tags and Red Tags must be purchased from the Borough Office **before noon the Friday prior to the pickup date**. Place large appliances and tires curbside Sunday (no earlier than noon) as the hauler may begin pickup as early as 2:00 a.m. on Monday. If you purchased a Blue Appliance Tag or a Red Tag and did not use it for a previous collection, please notify the Borough Office **before noon the Friday prior to the pickup date** so your item and address can be placed on the list for the next collection date.



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Code Enforcement Reminders

When do I need a permit?

That is a question many people ask when it comes to doing work around their homes. There are multiple types of permits issued by the Borough, such as building, mechanical (HVAC), and electrical permits. We also issue standalone permits or permits issued in conjunction with other permits, such as zoning, sidewalk, and driveway permits. Below are some examples of projects that do and do not require permits, but to be safe, it is always best to contact the Codes and Zoning department before starting any project.



Common Projects that DO require permits through the Borough:

- ✓ Deck
- ✓ Addition
- ✓ Remodel
- ✓ Demolition (partial or total)
- ✓ Sidewalk or driveway work
- ✓ Mechanical system or component repair/replacement
- ✓ Sewer lateral repair/replacement
- ✓ Swimming pools that hold over 24 inches of water

Common Projects that usually DO NOT require permits:

- ✗ Roof replacement (non-structural)
- ✗ Replacement of vinyl or aluminum siding (may require Historical Review)
- ✗ Replacement of doors and windows (if you do not change the opening size) (may require Historical Review)
- ✗ Replacing kitchen cabinets or countertops
- ✗ Painting and paper hanging

Selling a property?

Every property to be sold within the Borough is required to have a property disclosure inspection conducted prior to its sale. These inspections look for issues relating to sidewalks, driveway, driveway apron, chipping paint, abandoned and uninspected vehicles, crumbling chimneys, grass, weeds, junk storage, etc.

Answering the Call: The Blue Rock Firehouse Project

The Blue Rock Regional Fire District was incorporated in 2011 through an agreement between Manor Township and Millersville Borough. With a mission statement of One Team. Our Mission. Your Safety., the district covers 55 square miles of Manor Township and Millersville Borough, including six miles of the Susquehanna River.

There is a dire need for a new firehouse to replace the Highville and Washington Boro stations. By building a new station in Washington Boro and with the existing West Lancaster and Millersville stations, Blue Rock will be able to continue to protect and serve everyone in the district.

The new two-story building will include five drive-through bays and sleeping quarters for our volunteers.

Prepare for the 2027 Property Reassessment!

Lancaster County is preparing for the 2027 property reassessment and encourages property owners within the County to do the same. Counties are required by law to conduct periodic reassessments of all properties. The County of Lancaster previously completed reassessments in 2017.

Property owners can begin checking their property record through the Property Assessment Website (<https://www.lancastercountypa.gov/154/Property-Assessment>) to ensure that all data on file is correct. Property owners who find inaccurate or missing information may complete a Property Correction Form (<https://www.lancastercountypa.gov/DocumentCenter/View/17043/Property-Correction-Form->) or may contact the Property Assessment Office by emailing paquestions@lancastercountypa.gov.

A reassessment is the process used to determine accurate and fair property values within the County. The process of the assessment will begin in 2025 for the 2027 Reassessment. In

2025 and 2026, an assessor from the Lancaster County Property Assessment Office may visit your property for an outside-only inspection, including taking photos from the exterior of the property. Assessment staff will have county identification, and their vehicles clearly marked designating them to be from the Property Assessment Office.

The purpose of a reassessment is to ensure the fairness of taxes relative to property values, not to increase taxes. Reassessment does not generate additional revenue for the County or other real estate taxing bodies. Even though a property's assessment may increase, taxing bodies must adjust their current tax rate to remain revenue neutral, before making any other adjustments.

Recent Ordinances

Ordinance 2025-03 – New Chapter 110, Alarm Systems

Passed March 25, 2025. This Ordinance amended the Millersville Borough Code of Ordinances to add a new Chapter 110, Alarm Systems. Chapter 110 defines false alarms, details policy and procedure in the Borough for false alarms, and establishes fees for repeat violations.

Ordinance 2025-02 – Zoning Amendment: Green Energy Overlay District

Passed March 11, 2025. This Ordinance established a new zoning district to provide for and encourage development and investment in green energy and renewable resources on a scale, in locations, and subject to regulations appropriate for Millersville Borough.

Ordinance 2025-01 – Zoning Amendment: Community Resource Facility

Passed February 11, 2025. This Ordinance created a new use entitled “Community Resource Facility” to allow for certain social welfare and community benefit organizations to operate within the Borough.

Ordinance 2024-04 – Zoning Amendment: Short-Term Rentals

Passed June 25, 2024. This Ordinance amended Chapter 380, Zoning, to add the definition of a “Short-Term Rental,” primarily amending Section 380-34 to provide regulations governing Short-Term Rentals in the Borough.

Freedom Memorial Park

Millersville Borough is home to Freedom Memorial Park, a beautiful 21.1 acres that have been operated as community parkland for almost 50 years. The park maintains a variety of passive and active recreation facilities, including a Veteran's Memorial, 3 picnic pavilions, restrooms, a walking trail, the Rutter Gazebo, 2 little league/softball fields, a skate park, playground equipment, and a basketball court.



During the warmer months, park pavilions, ballfields, and the Rutter Gazebo may be reserved by members of the public at large. Park reservations for the 2025 season will continue **through October 9, 2025**. Reservations for the 2026 season may be made starting January 2, 2026, for events taking place between **April 17 and October 8, 2026**. In order to check on pavilion availability, please call 717-872-4645 or visit the Borough Office at 100 Municipal Drive. Park reservations may be made in person at the Borough Office, or by dropping off or mailing a park reservation form with payment to the Borough Office. Park reservation forms are available on the Borough Website under "Forms and Documents". All park reservations are on a first-come, first-served basis. Park reservations may not be made over the phone or online. Park reservations are not final until payment is received.

Veterans Day Ceremony

All are welcome to join us in honoring our veterans at Millersville Borough's annual Veterans Day ceremony! The ceremony will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 11, 2025, at Freedom Memorial Park, 9 Shertzer Lane, Millersville. The event will feature a guest speaker, and it will be attended by various government officials and veterans' organizations from the local community. Parking will be available in any of the three lots located in Freedom Memorial Park, and light refreshments will be served at the park after the ceremony. Event will be held rain or shine.

The ceremony will include remarks from Mayor David Aichele, Borough Manager Rebecca DeSantis-Randall, and Police Chief Jeff Margevich, as well as representatives from state and county governments. The Red Rose Veterans Honor Guard also participates in the ceremony every year and will kick off the Veterans Day service.

Millersville Borough held its first Veterans Day ceremony in 2013 as part of the dedication of the memorial at Freedom Memorial Park. The memorial includes bricks that have been engraved with the names of veterans from the local community. Local residents may purchase bricks from the Borough to honor a friend or a family member who has served in the military; each brick is dedicated at the park during the annual ceremony. The memorial currently includes 844 engraved bricks.



Hometown Heroes Banner Applications

Hometown Heroes Will Open Again in 2026!

In 2025, the Borough was proud to honor the proud men and women who have served our country through the new Millersville Hometown Heroes Banner program. The Borough invited residents to recognize a past or present member of the Armed Forces with a tribute street pole banner. For the first year of the program, the Borough was approved to install 23 banners, which were hung throughout the Borough just before Memorial Day 2025.

Now, the Borough is excited to open another round of Hometown Heroes Banner applications in early 2026. The cost of a banner is anticipated to be \$300, which covers the cost of the banner, the mounting kit, and pole attachment survey costs. Storm Water Management NPDES and MS4 Programs

The Borough has developed a stormwater management program that provides details of how the community will comply with the requirements of their permit. Six (6) Minimum Control Measures (MCMs) required under the State's General NPDES permit for MS4 communities include:

- MCM 1 – Public education and outreach
- MCM 2 – Public participation and involvement
- MCM 3 – Illicit discharge detection and elimination
- MCM 4 – Construction site runoff control
- MCM 5 – Post-construction storm water management in new development and redevelopment
- MCM 6 – Pollution prevention and good housekeeping for municipal operations and maintenance

The goals of the Borough's MS4 program are to reduce the discharge of pollutants into our waterways. All pollutants that the water carries end up in the stream and ultimately into the Chesapeake Bay. You can help to keep our water clean by doing the following:

- Properly dispose of water from your property (rainwater, pool water, sump pumps, etc.)
- Clean up after your pets
- Use fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides correctly
- Properly secure and store materials that could pollute stormwater

In addition, please monitor the stormwater facilities that you see or live near. If you see something that is causing these facilities to be polluted or blocked, please contact the Borough immediately at 717-872-4645; leave a message after normal business hours. If it is an emergency situation, please contact the police department at 717-872-4657. Examples of illicit discharges include:

- Sediment leaving a construction site during a storm or being carried out onto the public road
- Spills (Chemical, Gas, Oil)
- Illegal dumping activity into streams or stormwater facilities
- Dry weather flows from outfalls into streams (at least 72 hours after a storm)

Rave Mobile Safety is the official alert notification system used by Millersville Borough to communicate with community residents for Borough emergencies, events and notices.
